Aerial view	A picture taken from above that shows the layout of a place.
Teamwork	Working together with others to complete a task or play a game.
Instruction	A clear direction that helps someone know what to do.
Map	A picture that helps shows you where things are.
Steve Backshall	A man who loves animals and exploring the world.
Listening	Paying attention to sounds or words.
