National Curriculum Links:

Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding.
Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.
Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.
Engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others; seek clarification and help.
Read carefully and show understanding of words, phrases and simple writing.
Write phrases from memory, and adapt these to create new sentences, to express ideas clearly.

Essential Prior Learning:

Understand that French nouns are masculine or feminine.
Numbers 1 to 10.

Progression in Skill:

Name some common classroom objects, say what colour they are and their position in relation to other objects.
Extend the number of classroom instructions understood.

Know that French nouns are either masculine or feminine.

Introduce the definitive noun: *le, la, les*.

Recognise that the adjective usually comes after the noun in French.

Recall and repeat short phrases with increasing confidence.

Identify key vocabulary in short spoken phrases.

Recognise familiar words and phrases in writing.

Write familiar words from memory, although there may be some inaccuracies in spelling.

Long-term Memory Knowledge:

Name classroom objects, answering the questions

Qu'est-ce que tu as? and Qu'est-ce que c'est?

Name colours and describe an object's colour.

Recognise, follow and repeat classroom instructions.

Understand the adjective usually follows the noun in French.

Know that the definitive noun varies according to gender.

Relevance

Now	Children develop a vocabulary they can use daily in the classroom that has immediate relevance for them.
