

# Music development plan summary: Sussex Road Primary School

This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

## Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

When planning our music curriculum, we have used the Model Music Curriculum as a guide and use Sing Up resources to provide support with planning and delivery as it is closely aligned with the progression in skills recommended by the Model Music Curriculum.

Across the school year, children in Key Stages One and Two receive the equivalent of 45 minutes per week of music curriculum time. These sessions provide children with opportunities to sing, listen to a range of music from different times and cultures, compose, perform and develop their musicianship. Our Year R children have

opportunities to sing a range of well-known nursery rhymes and songs daily. They have opportunity to explore musical instruments as part of their daily provision.

Our Year 5 children have the opportunity to learn the ukulele through whole-class ensemble teaching, with support from Kent Music, who have supported us in developing our music curriculum and providing continuous professional development for our staff.

## **Part B: Co-curricular music**

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Our specialist peripatetic music teacher offers one-to-one private instrumental lessons for the piano and group drumming sessions with djembes; there is a cost to families for these but the school offers subsidies for children in receipt of pupil premium funding.

Reception and Year 1 children have the opportunity to join a music club which is run by a specialist music teacher. The children have the opportunity to sing songs and play percussion instruments.

Key Stage Two children are invited to join our Sussex Road choir and have the opportunity to perform at events such as the Christmas Service and Summer Fair. They also work towards a musical production. These opportunities are at no cost to families.

Our Year 4, 5 and 6 children have the opportunity to join our Young Voices choir where they perform at the O2. Parents are encouraged to attend and take part. There is a cost to families but the school offers to subsidise the experience for children in receipt of pupil premium funding.

Kent Music provide a range of opportunities for children – from beginners to more advanced – which parents are informed of via our newsletter. There are some costs to families.

## **Part C: Musical experiences**

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Children from Years One to Six take part in weekly singing assemblies, engaging in a repertoire based on the Model Music Curriculum, developing their understanding of music from different time periods and cultures.

Our Year 2 cohort have the opportunity to see and hear musicians from the Philharmonic Orchestra play music from the carnival of the animals.

Our Year 4 cohort have the opportunity to work with the English National Opera and create a composition to finish one of their pieces of music.

The Key Stage Two choir rehearse and perform a musical each year.

Year EYFS and KS1 perform in a Christmas show.

Key Stage Two attend and perform in a carol concert.

Year 5 have the opportunity to see a ukulele band and to take part in a ukulele performance to their families for their enquiry showcase.

## **In the future**

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

We will continue to work with Kent Music to ensure that we are offering our children diverse and interesting musical opportunities, as well as developing the skills of our teaching staff to deliver our curriculum.

We are aiming to introduce children to a wider range of live music experiences, making use of local theatres, schools and music groups.
