Does the punishment always fit the crime?

ART & DESIGN



Andy Warhol used printmaking to repeat a basic image and create endless versions of it, using different colours or adding paint to the surface. He used photographic silk screen printing to create his art.

Create and use screen prints.

Build up layers and textures.

Long-term Memory Knowledge

Talk about different pieces of artwork using language such as shape, colour, texture.

Recognise that Andy Warhol's soup cans artwork may be considered still life and compare with known works of Ria Hills and Childe Hassam.

Talk about how Andy Warhol created some of his most well-known artwork.

Use a stencil to produce a screen print.

Create a screen print that has more than one layer, letting each one dry between applications.

Key Vocabulary

screen printing	a technique of creating a picture or pattern by forcing ink onto a surface through a screen of fine material
experimentation	the action or process of trying out new ideas, methods, or activities
abstract	uses visual language of shape, form, colour and line to create a composition which may exist with a degree of independence from visual references in the world
mesh screen	a bit like a net: fabric that is made up of tightly interwoven

	threads so that liquids can pass through slowly
squeegee	a tool used for spreading or pushing a liquid across a surface
mass-produced	manufactured in large quantities

Relevance

Now	Children's understanding of different art styles is widened - through Pop Art and printing - enabling them to be experimental in their own artwork.
Future	Children have a broad knowledge of different art styles, can talk confidently about what they do and don't like and enjoy experimenting with their own works of art.
