National Curriculum Links:

Take part in outdoor and adventurous activity challenges both individually and within a team, Enjoy communicating, collaborating and competing with each other.

Essential Prior Learning:

Identify pictures of features of the school on an aerial view map.
 Identify symbols representing features of the school on a plan.
 Work as a team to complete tasks using symbols and maps.
 Work collaboratively as a team to achieve a common goal.
 Giving clear instructions will help to keep you partner safe.
 When working as a team, everyone has a responsibility to make sure everyone can take part safely.

Progression in Skill:

Using an OS map of the local area, identify features around the school.
 Work as a team to complete tasks using symbols on an OS map.
 Develop the ability to work with a different people, either as a pair or in a team.
 It is important to be aware of what is around you when following a map so that you do not walk into hazards, e.g. open water.
 Bear Grylls is an adventurer, writer, presenter and former SAS trooper. One of the youngest climbers ever to reach the top of Mount Everest. Life motto: courage, kindness ... and never give up!
 Problem-solve effectively within a group.

Long-term Memory Knowledge:

Know what some of the symbols on an OS map represent.
 Orientate and follow a map in order to move from one point to another around the school.
 Work successfully in a team towards a shared goal showing good listening skills and showing respect to others.
 Recognise potential dangers in the local environment from the symbols on a map.
 Know who Bear Grylls is and talk about why he is inspirational and how we can learn from his motto.
