

### National Curriculum Links:

Talk about some simple ideas about Christian beliefs about God and Jesus.

Retell a story that shows what Christians might think about God, in words, drama and pictures, suggesting what it means.

Talk about issues of good and bad, right and wrong arising from the stories.

Ask some questions about believing in God and offer some ideas of their own.

## **Essential Prior Learning:**

Christians are people who believe in God and Jesus. Some of the people in our school are Christians. The Bible is a special book for Christians with lots of different stories in it.

## **Progression in Skill:**

Describe simply some Christian beliefs about God. Describe simply some Christian beliefs about Jesus. Retell a story that shows what Christians believe about God.

Share what a story about God might mean.

Share what the stories about Jesus say about good, bad, right and wrong.

Talk about issues of good and bad, right and wrong related to the stories.

Ask some questions about believing in God.

Explain some ideas of your own about God.

### Long-term Memory Knowledge:

Christians believe God is all-powerful, all-knowing, loving and forgiving.

Christians believe Jesus to be the son of God; He is very important to Christians.

Jesus told parables to teach people about God.

Christians try to live a 'good' life according to Jesus' teachings.
