

## Does the punishment always fit the crime?

### ART



#### National Curriculum Links

Improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay].

Create sketch books to record their observations and use them to review and revisit ideas.

Learn about great artists architects and designers in history.

#### Essential Prior Learning

Stencils can be used to create patterns.

Block printing has been used to create artwork.

Children will have layered using different colours and shapes.

#### Progression in Skill

##### Theoretical knowledge

Andy Warhol used printmaking to repeat a basic image and create endless versions of it, using different colours or adding paint to the surface. He used photographic silk screen printing to create his art.

##### Practical knowledge

Create and use screen prints.

Build up layers and textures.

#### Long-term Memory Knowledge

Stencils are cut out of card and placed under the screen.

A small amount of ink is worked across the screen using a squeegee, aiming to push it through in order to create the pattern on the stencil.

Screen printing can be used to create a multi-layered paint effect: once the first layer has dried, another stencil can be added and a different coloured ink applied.

More than one art form can be combined in order to create one piece of art: for example, a pastel design could be added to the print.

Art created using printing can be replicated and mass produced.

#### Key Vocabulary

<b>screen printing</b>	a technique of creating a picture or pattern by forcing ink onto a surface through a screen of fine material
<b>experimentation</b>	the action or process of trying out new ideas, methods, or activities
<b>abstract</b>	uses visual language of shape, form, colour and line to create a composition which may exist with a degree of independence from visual references in the world
<b>mesh screen</b>	a bit like a net: fabric that is made up of tightly interwoven threads so that liquids can pass through slowly

<b>squeegee</b>	a tool used for spreading or pushing a liquid across a surface
<b>mass-produced</b>	manufactured in large quantities

#### Relevance

<b>Now</b>	Children's understanding of different art styles is widened - through Pop Art and printing - enabling them to be experimental in their own artwork.
