**Year 3 – Stone Age to Bronze Age Workshop at Knole Park**

**Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> November 2024**

As part of our history learning next term, Year 3 will be visiting Knole Park to find out about life in the Stone Age and the Bronze Age. The workshops will be focused around the following four questions:

**What did they eat?**

**What did they wear?**

**Where did they live?**

**How do we know?**

The children will have the opportunity to handle a collection of replica artefacts, try prehistoric wall painting, use a saddle quern, design and colour their own deer skull headdress/mask and build a den in the parkland.

We will be leaving school at 9.30am and will return by the end of the school day. We will be travelling by coach and will be wearing a seat belt in accordance with current legalisation.

Please could we ask that children are not sent in with any pocket money as there are no opportunities to spend it on the day.

**On the day:**

In order to be more environmentally friendly and reduce plastic waste we encourage you to provide your child with a packed lunch and a drink (no nuts, kiwi fruit, or fizzy drinks) in a small backpack. Children should wear school uniform and black shoes and take a warm waterproof coat. Depending on the weather, the children may need a spare pair of shoes. We will let you know closer to the time.

The cost of this trip will be £9.70 per person and payments can be made through Arbor – TRIPS – Year 3 Knole Park Workshop. Please could all payments be made by Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November at the latest.
